Funeral services again limited to 25 people

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Effective today, Thursday, July 16, indoor funeral services in Pennsylvania are subject to a 25-person limit and outdoor burial services are limited to 250 people.

Citing an “unsettling climb in new COVID-19 cases,” [Gov. Tom Wolf and Secretary of Health Dr. Rachel Levine signed new orders](#) implementing “targeted mitigation efforts.”

Those measures include:

- Indoor events and gatherings of more than 25 persons are prohibited.
- Outdoor events and gatherings of more than 250 persons are prohibited.
- A discrete indoor private catered event is limited to 25 persons.

These limits includes staff members and will remain in effect until further notice.
