Temporary COVID-19 restrictions will be lifted on January 4, but prior limits on gatherings will remain

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The below information is current as of the publication date listed. Because COVID-19 response measures on all fronts are continually evolving, clients should stay alert to new developments and consult with counsel on any critical questions.

On December 30, 2020, Gov. Tom Wolf and Secretary of Health Dr. Rachel Levine [announced](#) that the tougher

COVID-19 mitigation measures [imposed earlier this month](#) – including a 10-person limit on indoor gatherings and a 50-person limit on outdoor gatherings – will expire at 8:00 a.m. on January 4, 2021.

That order includes gathering limits based on a percentage of maximum occupancy and measures addressing telework, cleaning, contact tracing, employee quarantine, and other employee and customer safety protocols.
